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| Objective | <p>The aim of the call is to establish a number of ambitious, innovative, multi-disciplinary and multinational collaborative research projects that aim at understanding the biomedical, psychological and/or social mechanisms of non pharmaceutical interventions in order to identify potential target sites for enhanced personalized interventions or a combination of pharmacological and non-pharmacological interventions.</p> <p>Proposals must focus on one or several of the following neurodegenerative diseases:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Alzheimer’s disease and other dementias • Parkinson’s disease and PDrelated disorders • Prion diseases • Motor neuron diseases • Huntington’s disease • Spinocerebellar ataxia (SCA) • Spinal muscular atrophy (SMA) |

| Eligibility: | <p>Fundación de Investigación HM Hospitales (FiHM) can only participate if applies together with Hospitals, primary health care or public health settings of the Spanish National Health System (SNS), or Accredited Health Research Institutes (IIS) in the same proposal. It is not allowed to apply independently, thus there must be two beneficiary Spanish institutions requesting funding to ISCIII in the same proposal.</p> <p>Consortia may consist of partners who receive funding for research by funding organisations participating in this joint call ("regular funded partners") as well as non-funded external collaborators.</p> <p>Each proposal must involve a minimum of three and a maximum of six regular partners, including the coordinator, from at least three different countries participating in this call. However, if the proposal involves at least one regular partner from an EU-13 country (i.e. Czech Republic, Hungary, Latvia, Poland, Slovakia) or from Turkey, the maximum number of regular partners is extended to seven. For reasons of transnational balance, no more than two regular partners from the same country are allowed to join a proposal. In addition, external collaborators (e.g., research groups from countries not participating in this call or research groups that are from countries participating in this call but do not apply for funding) may participate in proposals. External collaborators must secure their own funding.</p> <p>They must state in the proposal if these funds are already secured or how they plan to obtain funding in advance of the project start date.</p> <p>Eligibility of PI and team members</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Principal Investigators (PI) can only participate in one project proposal per call. • Principal Investigators (PIs) belonging to any IIS could apply only from the IIS or from any of the institutions belonging to the IIS. • The Principal Investigator (PI) and all members of the research group must belong to the eligible institution or be affiliated to CIBER or an IIS. |

| Financial Support | <p>FiHM</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Up to 175,000 € per partner (overheads included) • Up to 250,000 € per coordinator (overheads included) <p>Only 3 years projects.</p> <p>Eligible costs:</p> <p>Personnel costs for temporary employment contracts (scholarships are not eligible), with a maximum of 36 PM in total for the personnel contracts altogether.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Current costs, small scientific equipment, disposable materials, travelling expenses and other costs as included in AES 2022 that can be justified as necessary to carry out the proposed activities. • Overheads, according to AES 2022. • Double funding of the same concept is not allowed |

| Application materials | <p>There will be a two-stage procedure for applications: pre-proposals and full proposals. The revision of the proposals between these stages.</p> <p>Pre-proposal submission Pre-proposals must be submitted no later than 12:00h C.E.T. on March 1, 2022, via the electronic submission tool.</p> <p>Full proposal submission Full proposals must be submitted no later than 12:00h C.E.S.T on June 28, 2022, via the electronic submission tool. The Joint Call Secretariat will provide a full proposal template and further information to the coordinator. Adhering to this template is mandatory. Any changes applied during the revision should be described and justified in the full proposal</p> |

The national submission period will be published at AES 2022.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Spanish Applicants should periodically check in the web page of ISCIII if they are qualified. ISCIII may not send invitations to the mandatory national phase. • Due to administrative and legal regulations, the National Institute of Health Carlos III declares the end of September 2022 as national deadline for the decision on fundable project consortia which include Spanish partners to be funded by ISCIII. Any concerned applicant in a proposal for which no final decision has been made by the deadline, could be declared not fundable by ISCIII. • Any publication, data base, product or event protected with IPR or not, resulting from the granted project must acknowledge "Award no. XX by ISCIII thorough AES 2022 and within the JPND framework" even after the end of the project. <p>Requirements on data and repositories</p> <p>Researchers funded by ISCIII must make public the human genomic data, as well as relevant data (phenotype and exposition data) generated inside the funded project and will use open access repositories. Researchers must also make public all the necessary information for the interpretation of these genomic data, including lab protocols, data instruments survey tools. Regarding genomic data it is understood: association of complete genomes (GWAS), matrixes of de polymorphism of a single nucleotide (SNP) and sequence of genome, and transcriptomic, metagenomic, epigenomic and gene expression data. The researchers whose projects are funded by ISCIII are recommended to store their scientific data at the "ELIXIR Core Data Resources", or if non-European repositories or data bases are to be used they must be certified by ELIXIR or the US National Center for Biotechnology Information (NCBI).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • ISCIII may not fund any project that may require a repository and/or a data base without a plan ensuring sustainability and decommissioning after the end of funding. <p>Contact details:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • National Institute of Health Carlos III (ISCIII) • Candi S.
